### The Chase Is On

The 57th season of Ivy League football begins Saturday afternoon for both Princeton and Columbia, which will meet at 12:30 pm on Robert K. Kraft Field at Wien Stadium in New York City. Princeton is looking for its 10th Ivy League title and first since the 2006 season, while Columbia is going for its second Ivy League title, 51 years after its lone title in 1961.

Neither team has experienced much success in the league recently. Princeton's last winning Ivy League season came in 2006, and the Tigers have lost 13 of their last 14 Ivy League games. Columbia has had 15 straight losing seasons in Ivy League play, and it has gone 3-11 in the last two years.

### Lights, Camera, Action

Live video from Saturday's game will be available on both GoColumbiaLions.com and GoPrincetonTigers.com (though both will be showing the video feed produced by Columbia). Live audio for the game will also be available on both 103.3 FM WPRB and on GoPrincetonTigers.com. Dan Loney (play-by-play) and Craig Sachson (analysis) will be live at Kraft Field, with the pregame show scheduled to begin at 12 pm.

### Poll Position

The winner of Saturday's game will take its first step towards disproving the low preseason expectations of the Ivy League media. Columbia was picked to finish seventh in Ivy League play this season, while Princeton was picked to finish eighth.

Over the last decade, Princeton and Columbia have been picked to finish in the bottom half of the league 19 of a possible 20 times. The lone exception was a fourth-place projection for Princeton in 2007, one year after its Ivy League title.

### Good Memories

Princeton's last win came against Columbia, a 24-21 home victory during Week 3 of the 2011 season. The Tigers rushed for 227 yards, an effort that included a 117-yard outburst by sophomore Brian Mills. Princeton got touchdown receptions by Tom Moak and Mark Hayes; that same duo hooked up for the first touchdown pass for Princeton of the 2012 season.

It was also one of the best games of the season for eventual first-team All-Ivy Leaguer Caraun Reid, who recorded six tackles, a sack, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery in the victory. Andrew Starks had nine tackles for Princeton, while Khama Brown had eight.

### Bad Memories

Princeton's last visit to New York City turned into a 42-14 loss, the Tigers' worst road

loss in the history of the series and the second-worst loss overall. Princeton scored first, but current Columbia senior Sean Brackett threw five touchdown passes in a 42-14 Lion victory.

## Sixth Sense

Prior to the 2010 loss in Columbia, Princeton had won six straight road games at Columbia. Five of those six wins were decided by three points or fewer, with the lone exception being a 19-6 victory during the 2006 Ivy League championship season.

## Re-Pete

While Pete Mangurian may be the new head coach at Columbia, he has faced Princeton three times in the past. As the head coach at Cornell (1998-2000), he went 2-1 against Princeton. His lone loss was a 6-0 defeat in the first game ever played at Princeton Stadium.

## Tackling The Issue

Senior co-captain Andrew Starks has led Princeton in tackles each of the last two seasons, and he has ranked fourth in the Ivy League in each of the two years. He is on pace to at least match both marks this season, especially off a career effort last weekend against Georgetown.

Starks recorded 16 tackles against the Hoyas, including his first sack of the season, and now leads the Ivy League with 13.5 tackles per game. He has been named to the Ivy League Honor Roll after each of Princeton's first two games this season.

## Scout's Honor

At least five NFL scouts were credentialed for last Friday's showdown with Georgetown on ESPN. They have shown interest in the All-Ivy defensive line duo of Caraun Reid and Mike Catapano.

Reid, who led Princeton in tackles for loss (16), sacks (eight), pass breakups (three), quarterback hurries (three) and blocked kicks (three) last season, had six tackles and a sack against the Hoyas. Catapano, in his second year as a co-captain, had eight stops and was part of two sacks Friday night.

## Quarterly Report

Last season, Princeton gave up 21 second-half touchdown drives, for an average of 2.1 per game. Through two games this season, Princeton has allowed only one second-half touchdown drive (0.5 per game).

The Princeton defense has kept the Tigers in the hunt in each of the first two games. Though both were losses, both games were decided by three points or fewer; in the prior two seasons, only two of 18 losses had been decided by three points or fewer.

## Brown Bagged

Sophomore cornerback Khamal Brown, who has made 11 straight starts, recorded his first career interception last weekend. It was also Princeton's first forced turnover on defense; all three fumble recoveries by the Tigers have come on muffed punts.

Brown is tied for second on Princeton with 14 tackles, including 11 solo stops. Last season, Brown led all Princeton underclassmen with 51 tackles.

## The Middle Of It All

Junior Greg Sotereanos has twice matched his career-best with five tackles, and he has done so as the nose tackle between Caraun Reid and Mike Catapano. Sotereanos started all 10 games last season, but he had only five tackles in one game. He has had one tackle for loss in each of the first two games this season.

## A Family Affair

Freshman Di Andre Atwater made his debut in the offensive backfield last weekend, and he quickly turned it into a memorable debut. Atwater rushed for 92 yards on 15 carries, and his first rush in the fourth quarter turned into a 53-yard touchdown.

Atwater had plenty of family there to watch his breakout game. He is the son of Letha and Steve Atwater; the latter is an eight-time Pro Bowler who is best remembered as the two-time Super Bowl champion safety of the Denver Broncos. Atwater's older brother Steve is a junior defensive back on the Georgetown Hoyas.

## The Longest Road

Di Andre Atwater's 53-yard touchdown run last Friday was the longest Princeton rush in the span of 30 games. Prior to that rush, the longest carry for a Princeton player had been a 68-yard touchdown run by sophomore quarterback Tommy Wornham in a road win at Lehigh.

Last season, Chuck Dibilio's longest rush was 48 yards.

## Roman Empire

After two injury-plagued seasons, junior wideout Roman Wilson has already surpassed his career totals in his first two weeks of the 2012 season. He led the Tigers with four catches for 40 yards against Lehigh, and he added a two-point conversion catch to get Princeton within three points. Last Friday night, Wilson had two catches for 62 yards, including a 34-yard reception. His 102 yards receiving is more than twice as many as any other teammate.

In his first two years at Princeton, Wilson had recorded a total of three receptions for only 25 yards.

# Covering Princeton Football

## Point, Counterpoint

While Princeton has depth at the wide receiver position (six receivers have caught at least two passes), it has not gotten enough production on the scoreboard. Over the last 17 quarters, Princeton wide receivers have not caught a touchdown pass, and they have only caught a total of one (Shane Wilkinson at Harvard) touchdown pass in the last nine games.

## Armed And Ready

Sophomore Connor Michelsen will make his Ivy League debut as a starter Saturday; he has completed 48.1% of his passes this season for 246 total yards, and he has yet to throw either a touchdown or an interception.

Michelsen became the third Tiger sophomore over the last 15 years to open a season as the starting quarterback; the previous two were David Splithoff (2001) and Tommy Wornham (2009).

## Triple Threat

While several freshmen made their collegiate debuts at Lehigh, none turned as many heads as Anthony Gaffney, who played in all three areas.

Gaffney, who has started at cornerback both games this season, opposite of Khama Brown, recorded two tackles and one pass breakup at Lehigh. He was used on a handful of offensive plays and, if that wasn't enough, he also returned one kickoff for 27 yards.

He made an even greater impact defensively last weekend, recording seven tackles, including two solo stops.

## Cloud Nine

Senior punter Joe Cloud is a two-time All-Ivy League selection, and he is averaging more than 40 yards per punt in his career. He has 25 career punts that have pinned opponents inside the 20, and he has 20 punts of greater than 50 yards.

Cloud currently ranks second in the Ivy League with a punting average of 41.4 yards. He leads the league in pinning the opposition inside the 20 (six) and punts over 50 yards (four).

## Working Overtime

Since Princeton has won twice in overtime at Wien Stadium, it's worth noting: Princeton has played 15 overtime games in program history and has gone 8-7.

## The Crystal Ball

Princeton will play its final non-league game of the season Saturday at 6 pm when it heads to Fisher Stadium in Easton, Pa., to take on the Lafayette Leopards. Princeton leads the all-time series 38-4-3, and it has won five straight games over Lafayette. The first win for Bob Surace as head coach at Princeton came in a 36-33 overtime thriller over the Leopards during Week 2 of the 2010 season. The Tigers have also won their last two games at Fisher Stadium (2005, 2007).

Lafayette is off to its first 3-0 start since 2008, and it already has victories over both Penn and William & Mary. If Lafayette defeats Robert Morris Saturday (6 pm), it will have its first 4-0 start since its Colonial League championship season of 1988.

## Come Home

Princeton is on the road the next two weeks, but will return to Powers Field at Princeton Stadium Sat., Oct. 13, for a noon showdown with Brown. That game will be televised live on the NBC Sports Network.

The Bears have won five straight in the series, including a 34-0 victory in Providence last year.

# BOB SURACE '90

## THE CHARLES W. CALDWELL JR. '25 HEAD COACH OF FOOTBALL



Bob Surace '90, a key member of the 1989 Ivy League champion Princeton football team, is in his third year as the Charles W. Caldwell Jr. '25 Head Coach of Football at Princeton University. He had been an assistant coach for the Cincinnati Bengals for the prior nine seasons and helped the team to an AFC North title in 2009.



Surace has been given the responsibility of rebuilding the Princeton football program, and he has seen some impressive performances from his first two recruiting classes, including 2011 Ivy League Rookie of the Year

Chuck Dibilio, who rushed for more yards (1,068) than any other true freshman in Ivy League history last season. Princeton had the top rushing offense in the Ivy League in 2011, and the Tigers have had 16 All-Ivy League players in Surace's two seasons.

The 22nd head coach at Princeton, Surace was a first-team All-Ivy center when he helped the 1989 Tigers to a 6-1 league mark and a share of the Ivy title. In addition to his tenure with the Bengals, Surace was also the head coach at Division III Western Connecticut State University, where he put together an 18-3 record in 2000 and 2001.

Surace (pronounced "suh-RACE") had served as assistant offensive line coach for the Bengals for the last six years of his time with Cincinnati; prior to that, he served two seasons as an offensive staff assistant. In addition to his work with the line, he played a key role in the entire offensive staff's game preparation. In 2009, that offense helped the Bengals to a 10-6 record and a sweep of their AFC North rivals, including the defending Super Bowl champion Pittsburgh Steelers.

Under Surace's leadership, Western Connecticut advanced to the second round of the NCAA Division III Championship and won the Freedom Football Con-

ference title in 2001; the win in the NCAA playoffs was the first in school history. In 2000, the Colonials won the Northeast Championship ECAC playoff game. In both of Surace's seasons, the team ranked in the top 25 nationally in the American Football Coaches Association poll.

Surace grew up in a coaching family. His father, Tony, was head coach for his high school football and baseball teams in Millville, N.J.

Surace began his coaching career in 1990 as running backs coach at Springfield (Mass.) College, where he also earned a master's degree in sports management in 1992.

In 1994, when the Canadian Football League fielded teams in the U.S., Surace was with the Shreveport Pirates as the assistant to head coach and general manager Forrest Gregg, the former Bengals coach who guided Cincinnati to Super Bowl XVI.

His wife, Lisa, was a four-time letterwinner in women's soccer at Princeton and is a member of the Class of 1992. She holds a Ph.D. in psychology and is now the Lower School Head at Princeton Day School.

They have a daughter, Alison, and a son, A.J.

Surace is part of one of the richest traditions in all of college football. Princeton was involved in the first college football game ever played on Nov. 6, 1869, and has played a total of 778 all-time games with an all-time winning percentage of .675 and five former head coaches in the College Football Hall of Fame: William W. Roper, Fritz Crisler, Tad Wieman, Charles W. Caldwell, Jr. and Dick Colman.

# JAMES PERRY

**OFF. COORDINATOR/QBs**



James Perry, the all-time leading passer in Ivy League history, is in his third season as the offensive coordinator at Princeton in 2012 as he continues to bring his style of fast and physical football to Old Nassau.

In his first four weeks of the 2010 season, prior to a season-ending injury to starting quarterback Tommy Wornham, Princeton had the top-ranked wide receiver in the FCS (Trey Peacock) and the 12th-ranked player in total offense (Wornham). Last season, Princeton posted the top-ranked rushing offense in the league, and Perry saw freshman quarterback Quinn Epperly earn Ivy League Rookie of the Week honors in his first collegiate start at Dartmouth.

Perry, a former Ivy League Player of the Year and quarterback for the 1999 Brown Ivy League championship squad, came to Princeton after spending three years as a highly successful offensive assistant coach at his alma mater. Perry coached the quarterbacks and was the recruiting coordinator at Brown.

As an undergraduate at Brown, Perry led the Bears to the Ivy League championship in 1999, and he holds virtually every school and Ivy League passing record, including passing yards in a season (3,255) and career (9,294), completions in a season (309) and career (789), touchdown passes in a game (6) and career (74), and total offense in a career (9,236). He threw for over 400 yards in a game six times during his career, and he threw the first touchdown pass ever at Princeton Stadium.

He was a Walter Payton Award Finalist as a senior and won the Bulger Lowe Award as the Outstanding Offensive Player in New England. A three-time first team All-Ivy selection, Perry graduated from Brown with a Bachelor of Arts degree, and he went on to earn a Master's degree in Education Policy & Leadership from the University of Maryland in 2006.

# JARED BACKUS

**DEF. COORDINATOR/LBs**



Jared Backus, who has 18 seasons of collegiate coaching experience, is in his third season as the Princeton defensive coordinator.

He came to Princeton after three years as a defensive assistant coach at Temple University, where he helped rebuild the struggling program into a bowl-eligible football team.

While coordinating the Princeton defense, Backus also works with the Princeton linebackers. In his first two seasons, Backus has placed four of his linebackers on the All-Ivy League team. Andrew Starks, who has earned All-Ivy honors each of the last two seasons, ranked fourth in the Ivy League in tackles in both 2010 and 2011.

The Tigers also saw several defensive improvements during the 2011 season; the most impressive one came in rushing defense, where Princeton moved from seventh in 2010 to third in 2011.

After coaching the line for his first two seasons at Temple, Backus took over the linebacking corps during the fall of 2009. His only season as linebackers coach was one of the most memorable in the history of Temple athletics. The Owls won nine straight games and earned a berth in The Eagle-Bank Bowl.

Prior to joining the Owls, Backus spent five seasons at Bucknell, first coaching outside linebackers/special teams (2002) and defensive line/special teams (2003-04), before being promoted to defensive coordinator and linebackers coach (2005-06).

Backus was a two-year varsity letterwinner and one-year starter at linebacker at Springfield, earning a degree in physical education in 1993. He received a master of physical education degree from Springfield in 1998.

He and wife Amanda have a son, Garrett, and a daughter, Grace.
