



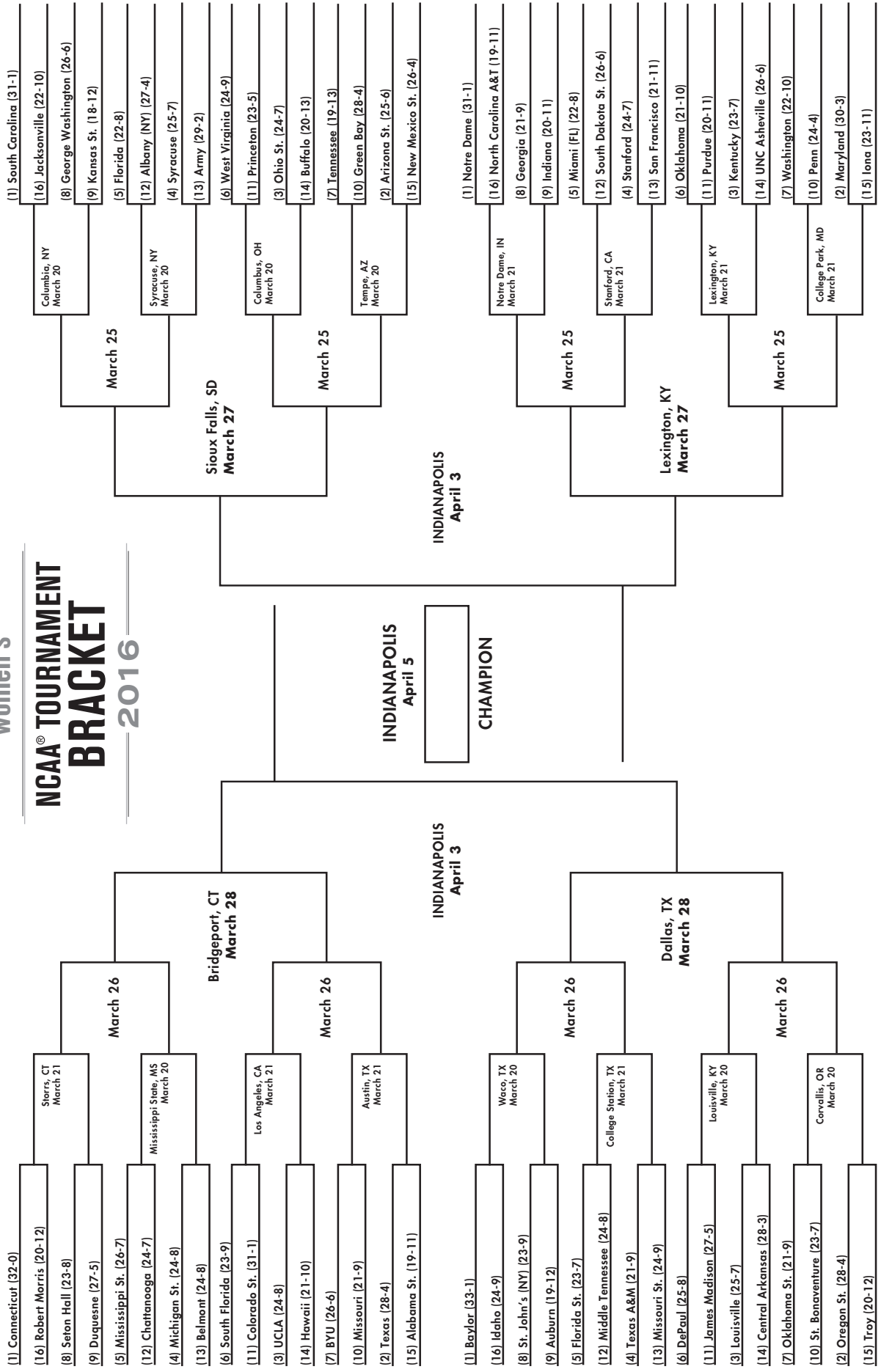

## NCAA FIRST AND SECOND ROUND GAME NOTES

### Welcome to the Show

- Princeton is making its sixth appearance in the NCAA Tournament. The No. 11 seeded Tigers will face off against the No. 6 seeded West Virginia Mountaineers in Sioux Falls, S.D. region on Friday at noon on ESPN2.
- The Tigers became the first team in Ivy League history to make the NCAA Tournament as an at-large since the conference became an automatic qualifier in the 1993-94 season.
- The team's No. 11 seed matches its mark from 2010.
- In their last appearance, the No. 8 seed Tigers scored the program's first ever NCAA Tournament victory and became just the second Ivy League team ever to earn a win in the Big Dance (Harvard, 1998) with an 80-70 decision over Green Bay before falling to the No. 1 seed Maryland, 85-70.
- In 2013, the ninth-seeded Tigers fell to No. 8 Florida St., 60-44, in Waco, Texas.
- In 2012, ninth-seeded Princeton dropped a 67-64 decision to No. 8 Kansas St. in Bridgeport, Conn.
- In 2011, the 12th-seeded Tigers fell to No. 5 Georgetown in College Park, Md., 65-49.
- In 2010, 11th-seeded Princeton lost to No. 6 St. John's in Tallahassee, Fla., 65-47.

### National Stage

- According to the NCAA Selection Show, the Tigers were one of the last four teams in the tournament.
- Princeton finished second in the CollegeInsider.com Mid Major Top-25 with two first place votes, moving up two spots from the previous week.
- The Tigers trailed Florida Gulf Coast (765), who did not make the NCAA Tournament.
- Princeton is the highest Ivy League team in the poll while Penn is 13th.
- The Tigers are 29th in the Jeff Sagarin/CBN Women's College Basketball Ratings and 36th in the NCAA RPI.

### In The Rankings

- Princeton places inside the top 10 nationally in rebound margin (2nd), defensive rebounds per game (4th), rebounds per game (6th), scoring margin (7th) and field goal percentage defense (8th) as of Monday night.
- Nationally, the Tigers rank inside the top 50 in field goal percentage (11th), three-point field goal percentage (12th), scoring offense (19th), assists per game (20th), assist-turnover ratio (46th) and three-point field goal percentage defense (49th).

### 2015-16 Season Review

- Princeton currently stands at 23-5 on the season.
- After a loss at Seton Hall (Nov. 19), the Tigers won seven straight contests, highlighted by wins over Michigan (Dec. 6) and Pittsburgh (Dec. 12).
- Following back-to-back losses including a 90-70 decision to No. 10/No. 12 Ohio State (Dec. 18), the team won two games to finish 11-3 during the non-conference portion of its schedule.
- The Tigers were defeated by Penn in the Ivy Opener (Jan. 9). Princeton proceeded to then win 12 consecutive Ivy League matchups to set up a de facto Ivy League Championship against Penn (Mar. 8).
- During the team's 12-game winning streak, Princeton outscored its opponents by an average of 22.7 points.

### Ivy League Notes

- The Ivy League is set to add another milestone in its storied history, adding men's and women's basketball tournaments to its slate of conference championships beginning with the 2016-17 academic year.
- Under head coach Courtney Banghart, the reigning National Coach of the Year the Tigers have posted a 104-19 (.846) record against Ivy League opponents.
- Princeton is averaging 76.0 points per game, highest among Ivy League foes.
- The Tigers place second in the Ivy in scoring defense at 57.8 per contest. Banghart's squad maintains the top scoring margin at +18.2.
- In its Ivy matchups, Princeton has held opponents to a .335 field goal percentage and .283 three-point field goal percentage.
- The Orange and Black hold a +14.4 rebounding edge in Ivy League play this season.
- Michelle Miller is averaging 14.4 points in the Tigers' conference games, good for 7th.
- Annie Tarakchian has the second best rebounding average in conference games (10.2).

### Climbing the Charts

- Michelle Miller currently stands at 1,311 career points; she is 8 points shy of 7th place on the all-time list.
- One of the program's most prolific shooters, Miller's 42.3 career three-point percentage is currently the second highest mark in school history.
- Miller's 212 made threes are the third most all-time while her 503 attempts from beyond the arc is ninth.
- Annie Tarakchian is fifth in program history with 739 rebounds.

• Alex Wheatley became the 24th member of the Tigers' 1,000-point club on Feb. 7 vs. Harvard.

• Wheatley is currently averaging a career-high 12.7 points, 6.1 rebounds and 2.0 assists per game.

• The senior also has a career high 84 offensive rebounds this season.

• Wheatley is also shooting a career-high 70.2 (59-84) percent from the free throw line.

• Wheatley's 55.7 career shooting percentage is currently tied for second in program history.

### Ivy Player of the Week

• Princeton has claimed 9 Ivy POTW awards this year.

• Senior Annie Tarakchian was picked as the Ivy League Co-Player of the Week on Mar. 7. It's her eighth career accolade making her one of just 11 players in Ivy League history to reach that milestone.

• Senior Alex Wheatley was named Ivy League Co-Player of the Week on Feb. 29. It was her third career POTW award and second this season.

• Senior Amanda Berntsen was selected as Ivy League Co-Player of the Week, the league on Feb. 22. It's was the senior's first career weekly award.

• For the seventh time in her career, Michelle Miller was picked as POTW on Feb. 8. She is one of just 15 players in conference history to reach that mark, joining her teammate, Annie Tarakchian and head coach Courtney Banghart.

• Miller also took home the accolade in January after averaging 16.5 ppg and 9.0 rpg against Marist and Hampton while shooting 50.0 percent from the floor and 53.8 percent from three.

• Annie Tarakchian took home league-wide honors on Nov. 16 and Nov. 30, while Miller garnered her first POTW award of the season on Dec. 7.

• Alex Wheatley was named the league's POTW on Dec. 14.

• Dating back to 2014-15, a Princeton player has claimed the Ivy League POTW award in 22 of the last 29 weeks in which the team has played a game and been eligible.

**Series History**

- Princeton has never played West Virginia.
- Princeton is 0-2 all-time vs. Ohio State, having lost 87-58 to the Buckeyes in in 1979 and 90-70 on Dec. 18, 2015.
- Princeton dropped Buffalo in the two team's only meeting, 78-55 on Dec. 19, 1992.

**Last Time Out For West Virginia**

- Texas ended West Virginia's run in the Big 12 Tournament with a 67-51 victory in the semifinals.
- Chania Ray hit a three-pointer to open the game, but Texas (28-3) used an 11-3 run to take an early lead.
- The No. 6/7-ranked Longhorns led by 15 at the half and started the third quarter on a 10-2 spurt to extend their advantage to 23.

**Scouting West Virginia**

- The No. 23/T-No.25 Mountaineers will be making its 11th overall appearanc in the NCAA Tournament.
- West Virginia (24-6, 12-6 Big 12) finished third in the Big 12 Conference and advanced to the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship semifinal game versus Texas.
- The Mountaineers are making their first NCAA tournament appearance since 2014 and the ninth time under coach Mike Carey. WVU has made the postseason for a school-record 10th consecutive year.

**Last Time Out For Ohio State**

- Michigan State defeated Ohio State, 82-63 in the Big Ten Semifinals.
- Kelsey Mitchell led the Buckeyes with 20 points but fellow All-Big Ten first-teamer Aerial Powers was on point most of the night and finished with a game-high 31 points and 12 rebounds for the Spartans.
- The Buckeye offense struggled to get in gear. OSU scored a season-low 20 points in the opening half and trailed 44-20 at the break.

**Scouting Ohio State**

- The Buckeyes are making their 23rd NCAA Tournament appearance and are playing in Columbus for the first time since 2011.
- Ohio State has an all-time record of 24-22 in the NCAA Tournament and has made seven Sweet 16 appearances. The Buckeyes have advanced to the Elite Eight three times with its best run being a runner-up finish in 1993.
- Senior Ameryst Alston and sophomore Kelsey Mitchell were named to the first team while junior Shayla Cooper and sophomore Alexa Hart were named to the second team.

## COURTNEY BANGHART HEAD COACH • 9TH SEASON • DARTMOUTH '00

Helping to guide Princeton to unprecedented heights, the 2015 Naismith National Coach of the Year, and named one of Fortune Magazine's 50 Greatest Leaders, Courtney Banghart recently wrapped up her eighth season as head coach of the women's basketball team. The winningest coach in program history, Banghart has amassed a 192-72 (0.727) overall record with a 104-19 (0.782) mark against Ivy League opponents.

Princeton's undefeated 30-0 regular season in 2014-15 was the best in Ivy League basketball history, mens or womens. Under Banghart's guidance, the Tigers also achieved the highest-ever ranking for an Ivy program, climbing as high as No. 13 in the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches polls.

Under Banghart's tutelage, the Tigers finished with a program-best mark of 31-1 last season. With an 80-70 first round victory over ninth-seeded Green Bay, Princeton became just the second Ivy program to record an NCAA win.

For her efforts, Banghart was named the Ivy League's inaugural Coach of the Year. Named one of Fortune Magazine's 50 Greatest Leaders, Banghart was also tabbed the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) National Coach of the Year and ECAC Coach of the Year.

Inheriting a team that had never played in the NCAA Tournament, Banghart has led the squad there in five of the last six years, capturing five Ivy titles in the process. Securing the best NCAA seed in Ivy history (No. 8) this past season, the Tigers were the No. 9 seed in 2012 and 2013 and the No. 11 and 12 seeds in 2010 and 2011, respectively.

Four different Tigers earned All-Ivy accolades in 2014-15, including three first-team selections (Blake Dietrick, Annie Tarakchian, Alex Wheatley). Of the four times that an Ivy program has placed three members on the first team, three of them have been by the Tigers. Princeton also saw three players receive first team laurels in 2010-11 (Devona Allgood, Addie Micir, Lauren Edwards) and 1977-78 (C.B. Tomasiewicz, Margaret Meier, Jackie Jackson).

For the fourth time in five years, a Tiger also laid claim to the Ivy League Player of the Year award (Blake Dietrick – 2015, Niveen Rasheed – 2012, 2013, Addie Micir – 2011). Since

her arrival in 2007-08, Banghart has aided in the development of two honorable mention All-America selections (Blake Dietrick, Niveen Rasheed), 13 first-team All-Ivy picks, seven second-team selections and two honorable mention recipients.

As a team, Princeton wrapped up its 2014-15 campaign ranked second in the nation in scoring margin (+23.2), three-point percentage (40.5), and field-goal percentage defense (34.2). Third in the country in field-goal percentage (49.1), the Tigers were sixth in rebounding margin (+11.2) and scoring defense (52.6), seventh in three-point defense (26.3), 12th in assists per game (16.9) and 19th in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.18).

Playing the most games in program history (32), the Tigers set school records in points per game (75.8), total points (2,424), field goals made (921), field goal attempts (1,831), field goal percentage (.491), rebounds (1,338), assists (541) and blocks (143).

Guiding the Tigers to at least 20 wins and a postseason appearance in each of the past six seasons, Banghart is no stranger to success. Jump-starting the Princeton renaissance, Banghart's 2009-10 squad finished 26-3, punching the program's first ticket to the NCAA Tournament.

Once again dominating the Ivy League in 2010-11, Princeton captured the second of four-straight conference titles, making a return trip to the NCAA Tournament. The Tigers won two more Ivy crowns in 2011-12 and 2012-13, respectively, posting records of 24-5 and 22-7. The 2011-12 squad finished the year ranked No. 24 in the AP Top-25 poll, becoming the first Ivy program to earn a national ranking.

As both a coach and a player, Banghart has made nine trips to the NCAA Tournament and two trips to the postseason WNIT. A four-year letterwinner and three-year starter at Dartmouth College, Banghart was a two-time first-team All-Ivy honoree and owns the Ivy League record with 273 career three-pointers. Knocking down a program-best 97 triples in 1999, she earned the Ed Seitz Award as the top three-point specialist in the nation.

Earning a bachelor's degree in neuroscience in 2000, Banghart worked at Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Va., where she served as the girls' athletic director and the head coach of the girls' basketball and tennis teams. Returning to her alma mater, she later earned a master's degree in writing and leadership development in 2007, while spending four seasons as an assistant coach for the Big Green.

## MILENA FLORES - ASSISTANT COACH

The 2015-16 campaign is Milena Flores' ninth season as an assistant coach with the women's basketball team, having joined the program in 2007. After working primarily with the guards over her first five seasons, she took over coaching the posts in 2012-13.

In her first season working with the posts, both Megan Bowen '13 and Kristen Helmstetter '14 earned Second-Team All-Ivy honors. The following year, Helmstetter garnered another all-conference second team selection, while Alex Wheatley '15 picked up honorable mention recognition. Last season, Wheatley and Annie Tarakhian '15 earned praise on the All-Ivy first team.

During her tenure, Flores has helped the Tigers to a 169-67 (.716) overall and 92-17 (.844) Ivy record. Princeton has won 20-plus games in each of the past six seasons, including four 24-plus win seasons and a trio of perfect 14-0 Ivy slates.

The Tigers, who earned the Ivy League's first-ever women's basketball national ranking in 2012 at No. 24, posted a historic 31-1 record in 2014-15, which included a perfect 30-0 regular season. Earning the highest-ever national rankings for an Ivy program (No. 13), Princeton captured their fifth Ivy title in six years and earned their first-ever NCAA Tournament win.

The Tigers finished the 2011-12 year at 24-5, 14-0 Ivy, and rode a 17-game winning streak into the NCAA Tournament. Forward Niveen Rasheed '13 was a Full Court All-America First Team selection, the unanimous Ivy League Player of the Year and a unanimous All-Ivy First Team honoree. Devona Allgood '12 earned her third straight All-Ivy selection, earning second team accolades.

The 2010-11 squad also posted a 24-5 overall record and earned votes in both national polls throughout the season. The Tigers went 13-1 in the Ivy League to win their second straight Ivy League Championship, earning the program's second consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament. Senior guard Addie Micir was named the Ivy League Player of the Year and sophomore point guard Lauren Polansky was named the Ivy League Defensive Player of the Year, the first time the awards have been given to the Orange & Black.

In 2009-10, Princeton went 26-3 with a perfect 14-0 mark in the Ivy League to reach the NCAA Tournament for the first time in program history. The team set numerous records during the year including: most wins in a season (26), winning 25 of those 26 games by double figures, most road victories (14), longest win streak (21), longest home win streak (9), fewest losses (3), best win percentage (.897), most conference wins (14), most points (2051), highest scoring average (70.7), ranking sixth in the nation in scoring defense and fifth in scoring margin.

Flores came to Princeton after honing her coaching skills at Pacific, Lehigh and Yale. During her playing career at perennial national contender Stanford, Flores helped the Cardinal to the NCAA Women's Basketball Final Four in 1997. She was named first-team all-Pac-10 in 1999 and 2000, and was an honorable mention selection in 1998. The previous year she received Pac-10 all-freshman honors.

Flores finished her career and still ranks third on Stanford's all-time assist list with 644. During her tenure she led the Cardinal in assists, free throw percentage and minutes during three of her four seasons. She also had the most steals on the team during the 1998-99 and 1999-2000 seasons. Flores was named a first-team all-Pac-10 academic honoree twice and earned GTE/CoSIDA Academic all-district honors. She earned her degree in 2001 in political science.

After Stanford, Flores earned an NCAA postgraduate scholarship and continued her playing career for the WNBA's Miami Sol as well as Lithuania Lietuvos Telekomas. Flores returned to California to serve as an assistant coach at Pacific during the 2002-03 and 03-04 seasons before heading east to Lehigh for one year. In 2004-05, Lehigh finished 19-10, the second-best record in the Patriot League that year.

Prior to joining the Princeton staff, Flores was the assistant coach at Yale, working primarily with the guards. She helped the Bulldogs to a nine-win improvement from 2005-06 to 06-07, and guided guard Melissa Colborne to Ivy League Rookie of the Year honors in 2005.

Flores is a native of Snohomish, Wash., and she currently resides in Lawrenceville, N.J.



## MEGAN GRIFFITH - ASSISTANT COACH/RECRUITING COORDINATOR

Megan Griffith is in her sixth year with the women's basketball program in 2015-16. Griffith was announced as an assistant coach on May 30, 2012 after spending two seasons as the Tigers' director of basketball operations.

Griffith will continue to serve as the team's recruiting coordinator and work primarily with the squad's perimeter players.

Last season, the Tigers posted a historic 31-1 record, which included an unblemished 30-0 regular season. Capturing its fifth Ivy title in six years, Princeton earned its highest-ever national ranking (No. 13) and secured its first-ever NCAA Tournament victory. Three Tigers garnered All-Ivy honors for their efforts, including Player of the Year Blake Dietrick '15, who also received Associated Press and WBCA Honorable Mention All-America honors.

In 2014-15, Princeton posted its fifth-straight 20-win season (21-9, 11-3 Ivy), garnering its fifth-consecutive (sixth overall) postseason berth. Eventually advancing to the second round of the WNIT, several Tigers garnered individual accolades, including first-team All-Ivy honoree Blake Dietrick '15.

In 2012-13, the Tigers won their fourth-successive outright Ivy League title behind a 22-7 overall and 13-1 Ivy record. Under Griffith's tutelage, Lauren Polansky '13 was named the Ivy Defensive Player of the Year for the third-straight season.

Griffith is no stranger to the Ivy League as a 2007 graduate of Columbia University and a four-year letterwinner for the women's basketball team. She captained the Lions for three seasons and was named All-Ivy League in 2006 and 2007. Griffith is just the eighth Lion to score over 1,000 points during her career, averaging 10.1 points per game. During her junior year, Griffith ranked 22nd in the nation in assists, averaging 5.5 per game, while chipping in 15.2 points per game. She was twice named Academic All-Ivy and was a member of the Arthur Ashe Sports Scholar Team two straight years.

Following graduation, Griffith played three years of professional ball in Europe. She joined FoA Nice Basketball in Forssa, Finland during the 2007-08 season and was named the team's MVP at the end of the season. In 2008-09, Griffith led the Espoo Basket Team to the National Finnish Championship and the Finnish Cup Championship titles. During the year she was also a youth basketball coach for Honka Basketball Club.

Griffith was also a member of the Celeritas-Donar Basketball team in Groningen, Netherlands. In addition she was named a U20 Dames 1 assistant coach and U18 Northern Selection Team assistant coach, while working as a youth coach and clinic director for Celeritas-Donar.

Griffith founded Back to Basics Basketball in 2008, an organization developed to teach basketball skills, while provide training and mentoring in her hometown.

A native of King of Prussia, Pa., Griffith graduated from Columbia with a degree in economics in 2007.

## CHESSIE JACKSON - ASSISTANT COACH



Chessie Jackson enters her first season as a member of the Princeton women's basketball coaching staff in 2015-16 and will assist in all parts of the program including player development, on floor coaching, recruiting, and scouting.

A four-year starter at Williams College, Jackson served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Smith College last season. Prior to her tenure with the Pioneers, Jackson spent a year as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Rochester.

As the assistant basketball coach and recruiting coordinator at Smith, Jackson aided with all aspects of the Pioneers' program while serving as the squad's lead recruiting coordinator. Working with the team's post players, she assisted in the development of NEWMAC Rookie of the Year Samantha Alakai.

As an assistant at Rochester during the 2013-14 season, Jackson helped coach first-team All-UAA forward Loren Wagner, second-team all-conference pick Ally Zywicki, and honorable mention selection Danielle McNabb.

Prior to Rochester, Jackson was a graduate assistant coach at Smith. During Jackson's initial two-year stint with the Pioneers, Smith posted a 46-11 overall record, capturing the 2011-12 ECAC New England championship before advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament the following season.

A former standout at Williams, Jackson was a four-year starter and senior captain for the Ephs. Helping the team to a pair of NCAA appearances, including a Sweet 16 berth in 2009-10, she finished fourth on the program's scoring list (1,346) and ninth in rebounds (635). A second-team All-NESCAC honoree as a junior, Jackson garnered first-team all-conference and All-NEWBA accolades during her senior season, while also being named the Ephs' Most Valuable Player.

Graduating from Williams with a bachelor's degree in political science with a concentration in leadership studies, she earned a master's in exercise and sport studies from Smith in 2013.

## TYLER CORDELL - DIRECTOR OF BASKETBALL OPERATIONS



The 2015-16 season is Tyler Cordell's fourth as the program's director of basketball operations. In her first three seasons with the Tigers, Princeton has posted a 74-17 overall and a 38-4 Ivy record.

Cordell joined Princeton after spending the 2011-12 season as a graduate assistant with the Ithaca College women's basketball program. She assisted the reigning Empire 8 champions with player development, film exchange and breakdown, recruiting and scouting. The Bombers went on to win the most games in program history at 24-5 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Division III Tournament.

A 2011 graduate of Ohio Wesleyan University, Cordell was a four-year letterwinner on the women's basketball team. A three-year captain, she earned All-NCAC First Team honors three times. In 2009, the Bishops won the NCAC Tournament and Cordell earned tournament MVP honors. She concluded her career as the all-time assist leader in program history with 495 and is in the Bishops' all-time top-10 in points scored with 1,507.

A native of Columbus, Ohio, Cordell graduated from Ohio Wesleyan in 2011 with a dual degree in sociology and sport management. She earned her master's in sport management from Ithaca in 2012.
